Anyone who is sexually active can be exposed to sexual risks, such as sexually transmitted infections, unwanted pregnancies, or coerced sex. However, some may be at greater risk. It is the case for migrants living in Switzerland under precarious legal and socio-economic conditions, those belonging to gender and/or sexual minorities and those engaged in sex work. This is what is shown by the Mi.STI study (Migration and vulnerability to HIV/STI), commissioned by the Federal Office of Public Health and conducted by a team of sociologists from the University of Fribourg in collaboration with field workers.

This **participatory conference** is organized and facilitated by scientists, field workers and migrants. Its objective is to provide spaces for discussion on the issues, intervention strategies and approaches in the field of «sexual health and migration» based on the results of the Mi.STI research.

The conference alternates plenary sessions (presentation of scientific results) with discussion workshops. The latter will be led jointly by field actors and migrants and will the public will be invited to participate in the debates.


